
Social Media Trends

Cyberbullying?

Cyberbullying, v: the use of technology such as computers and cell phones to engage in repeated, and hostile behavior by an individual or group, that is intended to harm others.

School Consequences for Cyberbullying

- Neb. Rev. Stat. 79-2,137
- Definition: "ongoing pattern of physical, verbal or electronic abuse"
- Consequences:
 - Loss of extracurricular privileges
 - Detentions
 - Loss of recess
 - Suspension
 - Expulsion
 - Alternative School Assignment

Jackson v. Lander, (5th Cir. 2015)

- Cheer squad has conflict during news story
- Conflict escalated to Facebook
 - i am so sick of u bossing me around ... and so is other people on the squad
 - im not tryin to b mean at all but if i have a problem with you i will confront u and will not be nice about it
 - im sorry for what i did at the news station well not really
 - Trust me, the next time you go off on me, theres gonna b problems and I may get kicked of the squad for it but idk cuz my parents didnt raise me not to stick up for myself

Jackson v. Lander, (5th Cir. 2015)

- Cheer sponsor got involved
 - Suspended from cheer for 2 weeks
 - Required all cheerleaders to provide username and password
 - Cheerleader did not make the squad the following year
 - Sued
- Court: search pertained to school activities based on reasonable belief the quarrel began at a school-related activity

Civil Consequences

- Student and parents getting sued
 - Homeowners insurance might pay
 - Money judgments
 - Home/car foreclosure
 - Injunctions and restraining orders against kids

Mihnovich v. Williamson Co.

- Student adopted from Ethiopia
 - Received mean and racist texts
 - Facebook page: "Hate Black **** N.M.! Who Else Does?"
 - Received nude photograph of a female classmate
- Sued
 - School and 31 classmates
 - Seeking \$1.1 million

Cooks v. Tulsa Sch. Dist., et al

- Student changing after volleyball
- Teammates held down, took picture of her and posted to Twitter
- Family suing
 - Twitter
 - School district
 - Students who took/tweeted pic for IIED, assault, battery, privacy
 - Parents of students

My Suggestions


- PARENTS have user names and passwords







The firearm, later determined to be an airsoft gun, was located at another residence and collected as


In re Juvenile John Does (Fairfax Co. Va 2013)









How to find secret apps on your kid's iPhone

Pending Cases

Cañon City, CO

- Hundreds of students traded nude pictures
- 400+ photographs of "over 100 kids"
- Used "vault" apps to accrue pictures and points
- "the pimp of pictures" had the most points
- Football players at center of scandal cancelled last game of the year
- Prosecutors considering charges

Pending Cases

Michigan

- 14-15 y.o. boys using classmates' photos to blackmail other classmates
- All under 16, may be charged as adults

Ohio

- 16-17 y.o. students charged with 3rd degree felonies
- May "settle" for 5th degree felonies
- Probation includes restitution and "rehabilitative detention"

Nebraska Law


- Neb. Rev. Stat. 28-813 et seq.
- Makes sexting (images) a class IV felony for offenders under 19
- Class IIIA felony for 19 and up
- Both punishable by:
 - Up to 5 years in prison and/or
 - \$10,000 fine
 - Require sex offender registration

Nebraska Law

•Affirmative Defense:

- the picture is only of the defendant; or
- defendant was younger than 19
- picture is of someone at least 15
- picture was taken voluntarily
- picture was given voluntarily
- picture contains only one child
- defendant hasn't shared the picture AND
- defendant didn't coerce taking or sending


